



ROTARY CLUB OF STRATHALBYN – VALERIE BALL AWARD

GUIDELINES

Purpose of the Award

The Strathalbyn Rotary Club – Valerie Ball Award, has been established as a partnership between The Rotary Cub of Strathalbyn and the Fleurieu Community Foundation. The award aims to provide support to young adult aged 18 to 25 years, who are living in the Strathalbyn district or have a close association with the old Strathalbyn Council area.

The award's main purpose is to support young adults who show initiative and commitment in undertaking education or training in Agriculture, Horticulture or Viticulture but who may be experiencing difficulty in continuing their studies or accessing other education or training due to hardship or disadvantage.

It is expected that several awards could be offered each year up to a total amount of \$1,000.

About the Fleurieu Community Foundation

The Fleurieu Community Foundation was established in 2010 to help philanthropic individuals and organisations support grass-root initiatives that respond to community needs. It uses charitable giving to meet the current and future needs of local communities. The Foundation currently offers several grants and programs across the Fleurieu.

Who can apply?

Young adults

- Aged 18 to 25 years who are attending or enrolled to attend, a recognized course ofstudy and training in Agriculture, Horticulture or Viticulture.
- Live in the Strathalbyn district or who have a close association with the old Strathalbyn Council area.
- Generally, this award is available to first time applicants, although a previous successful applicant may still e considered based on their situation and need.
- Priority will be given to students who are experiencing difficulties in continuing their study or training due to hardship or disadvantage but have shown commitment andinitiative in pursing their goals.

What can the award be used for?

The award can be used for:

- Education and training costs.
- Associated living, travel and boarding costs.
- Associated compulsory costs such as uniforms, safety clothing, stationery and equipment required to undertake the field of study and training.

Application Procedure

Applicants must complete the application form and include two signed letters of support from referees. The referees should have a direct knowledge of the applicant's character, life situation and educational or training goals and aspirations

Applicants are welcome to discuss their application and are encouraged to do so if they are unsure of the eligibility to apply or need assistance. Applicants can contact the Rotary Clubof Strathalbyn for support in applying for this grant.

Application Review Process

An advisory committee of the Rotary Club of Strathalbyn will evaluate the applications and make recommendations to the Fleurieu Community Foundation Board.

The Board will then have the final approval on successful applications and on the distribution of the award.

To ensure that informed decisions are made, on occasions, applicants may be requested to provide additional information. Applications can be lodged at any time throughout the year and will normally be assessed once a year in November with funds provided in December for study commencing in Semester 1 the following year.

Under some circumstances a second round of applications may be assessed in May with funds provided in June for study commencing in Semester 2.

Successful applicants will be required to sign the Fleurieu Community Foundation funding agreement and provide a summary on the use of the funds. Successful applicants will also required to provide proof of enrolment before receiving the award.
